This week, I will be meeting with Dean Heinselman on Tuesday, initiating a project with the Center for International Education and Senator Adhikari on Friday, and attending the City of Eau Claire Transit Open Forum on Thursday at 5:00 (which you all received an invite to).

I am looking forward to yet another productive week and watching some great projects come to fruition within this body. I want to give one more charge to you all to consider noticing and working to address the issues that you see as students. I am very glad that this week's meeting will be a quick one and thankfully is only our first meeting with nothing on the agenda, but I do not want us to make a habit out of it.
