Brief History of Issue - why the issue is being considered:

The Department of Communication Sciences and Disorders is requesting a name change to the American Sign Language (ASL) Certificate (Code 622-601) to American Sign Language Studies, Certificate (Code 622-601). The certificate is frequently confused with the certification (and licensure) required to serve as a sign language interpreter. To clearly identify the difference, the department would like to change the name of the program to "American Sign Language Studies" to try to emphasize the more introductory nature of the certificate.

1. Terminology usage of "Studies" vs "Proficiency".

2. Requirements to become an interpreter.
