BILL: Placing Donation Bins in Residence Halls in Support of the Campus Closet and Campus Food Pantry

1	WHEREAS, 80% of surveyed students indicated that food insecurity is an issue that college
2	students face (see attachment E); and
3	WHEREAS, according to the director of the campus food pantry, 25% of UW Eau Claire students
4	are food insecure; and
5	WHEREAS, the campus food pantry & closet fully rely on donations; and
6	WHEREAS, to the knowledge of the Senate, there are no permanent donation bins for the campus
7	closet or food pantry in the dorms; and
8	WHEREAS, the bins, even if empty, will require someone to maintain them; and
9	WHEREAS, the project has been made a part of the Service-Learning Program (see attachment
10	C); and
11	WHEREAS, if the student manning this project is a Senator, they will receive outreach hours as
12	well as service learning hours; and
13	WHEREAS, the student senate is able to completely fund this project through the general
14	operations fund; and
15	WHEREAS, the administration in charge of housing is in support of this resolution; and
16	WHEREAS, the signage on the bins will provide information regarding the hours and locations of
17	the campus food pantry and closet; and
18	WHEREAS, 90% of surveyed students stated that they do not use the campus food pantry; and
19	WHEREAS, this project will help to bring awareness to the campus food pantry and closet; and
20	WHEREAS, the campus food pantry and closet have very limited hours which are hard for some
21	students to make with their schedules; and
22	WHEREAS, the hours and locations of the campus pantry and closet are stated in attachment D;

24	WHEREAS, students may take what they need from these donation bins if they are unable to
25	make it to the campus food pantry and/or closet (this will be indicated on the signs posted on the bins);

27	BE IT THEREFOR RESOLVED, following passage of this bill and implementation of this
28	project will begin on move out day; and
29	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, on move out day(s) the bins will be moved from the basement of
30	the residence halls to their lobbies; and
31	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, if the bins go unused whilst in place, this project will be
32	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, in attachment A the prices for each are broken down; and
33	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the process of maintaining these bins has been outlined in
34	attachment D; and

35	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, following passage of this bill, the student senate will financially
36	contribute to this initiative based on the guidelines within attachments A & B; and
