

# **APA Style Reference Pages**

There are many different methods of citation in use in various academic communities. Papers written in American Psychological Association (APA) style always include a Reference page listing all sources used in the text.

## **General Format & Basic Rules for Most Sources**

- Located at end of paper on a new page
- **Double-spaced throughout** and use **"hanging indent" format** (the first line of each reference is set flush left and subsequent lines are indented)
- General reference style: Titles are in sentence case; only the first word of the title and subtitle (the material after the :) and any proper names are capitalized. \*\**If no author is given, regardless of the format, put the title in the author position.*
- Alphabetize by last name of first author of each work
- For multiple articles by the same author(s), list entries in chronological order (earliest to most recent)
- Italicize titles of longer works (books, edited collections, newspapers, etc)
- Do not italicize, underline, or put quotes around titles of shorter works (book chapters, essays in edited collections)

## Book by 2 to 20 Authors

Print: Skidmore, R. A., Thackeray, M. G., & Farley, O. W. (1997). *Introduction to social work* (7th ed.). Allyn and Bacon.

## Book by More than 20 Authors

#### Citation of a Work Discussed in a Secondary Source

Example of in-text citation (secondary source): Glasser's study (as cited in Ellis, 1999)...

**Example of reference: (original source):** Ellis, A. (1999). Rational emotive behavior therapy as an internal control psychology. *International Journal of Reality Therapy*, *19*(*1*), 4-11.

## **Journal Article**

Basic Form: Author, A. A., Author, B. B., & Author, C. C. (Year). Title of article. *Title of Periodical*, *volume number (issue number)*, pages. https://doi.org/xx.xxx/yyyy
\*Include the DOI for print sources, if available.

Print: Hall, D. T. (1990). Promoting work/family balance. Organizational Dynamics, 18(3), 5-18.

- **Electronic with no DOI:** Mates, B. F., & Strommen, L. (1995). Why Ernie can't read: 'Sesame Street' and literacy. *The Reading Teacher*, *49*(*4*), 300-306. http://www.reading.org/general/Publications/Journals/RT.aspx
- **Open-Access (free online) with no DOI:** Tullos, A. (2004, June 8). The Carolina Piedmont. *Southern Spaces*. http://www.southernspaces.org/contents/2004/tullos/5a.htm

Always include the URL for open-access journals.

#### **Newspaper Article**

Electronic: Schwirtz, M. (2009, August 13). Russian navy joins search for freighter. *The New York Times*. http://www.nytimes.com

### **Magazine Article**

Print: Dicum, G. (2007, September). Eyes in the sky and on your desktop. Sierra, 92(5), 58-62.

Electronic (No Author) accessed through a subscription: A wiser wiki. (2007, May). *Utne Reader*, (141), 10-11. http://www.utne.com

#### **Encyclopedia Article**

Print: Corey, G. (1994). Self-esteem. In Encyclopedia of Psychology (Vol. 3, pp. 369-370). Wiley.

Electronic accessed through a subscription: Kaczkowski, C. (2006). Acid-base balance. In *Gale* Encyclopedia of Nursing and Allied Health (2nd edition). http://www.gale.cengage.com

## **Government Document**

Electronic, agency as author: Organization Name. (Year). Title of report. URL.

United States Government Accountability Office. (2019). *Performance and accountability report: Fiscal year 2019*. https://www.gao.gov/assets/710/702715.pdf

## **Interviews and Personal Communications**

Because they cannot be directly retrieved by a reader, personal communications such as telephone conversations, emails, and personal interviews are **not** included in the Reference list. In the text, give initials, surname of the communicator, and provide as exact a date as possible: (N. Schwartz, personal communication, April 1, 2001).

**Other types of interviews:** Khazan, J. (1980, December 4). Oral history interview with Jibreel Khazan. Greensboro Voices. The University of North Carolina at Greensboro, Greensboro.

## Miscellaneous Online: Website, Podcast, Blog Post, YouTube

Website: Lastname, F. M. (Year, Month Date). Title of page. Site name. URL

- Price, D. (2018, March 23). *Laziness does not exist*. Medium. https://humanparts.medium.com/laziness-does-not-exist-3af27e312d01
- **Podcast:** Host, A. A. (Host). (Year, Month Date). Title of episode (No. if provided) [Audio podcast episode]. In Name of podcast. Publisher. URL
- Prime, K. (Host). (2019, March 29). For whom the cowbell tolls [Audio podcast episode]. In *Radiolab*. WNYC Studios. https://www.wnycstudios.org/story/whom-cowbell-tolls

**Blog post:** Lastname, F. M. (Year, Month Date). Title of post. *Publisher*. URL Ninja. (2009, August 9). A dollar a day [Web log message]. http://www.punchdebtintheface.com

**YouTube or Streaming Video:** Last Name, F. M. [Username]. (Year, Month Date). *Title of video* [Video]. Streaming Service. URL

- Lushi, K. [Korab Lushi]. (2016, July 3). *Albatross culture 1* [Video]. YouTube. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=\_AMrJRQDPjk&t=148s
- **Note**: The person or group who uploaded the video is considered the author. If the author's name is the same as the username, you can omit the [Username].
