

# Clinical Experiences [AND] Collaboration Opportunities



## Human Development Center

The HDC is an interdisciplinary program that provides both educational support and behavioral health services to individuals, families, and schools in Wisconsin.

The *HDC Interdisciplinary Assessment Clinic* is a unique program that offers clinical training experiences to UWEC undergraduate and graduate students from nursing, social work, special education, school psychology, communication sciences and disorders, and reading education.

The *HDC Academic Intervention Clinic* is staffed by undergraduate and graduate students and provides evidence-based academic intervention services at the clinic and in local schools.

# What's going on at the HDC?



## Undergraduate Reading Internship

In the Interdisciplinary Assessment Clinic, you will work with children to examine their reading needs. You will complete assessments of reading skills, test evidence-based intervention strategies and consult with parents regarding assessment results. Interns work collaboratively with other interdisciplinary team members.



## Special Education Assessment Team

You will complete academic assessments as a part of the Interdisciplinary Assessment Team, which allows you to collaborate with other educational professionals and parents when examining a client's academic performance. The experience will provide you with a distinct advantage in job placement, as well as cultivating assessment competence.



## Academic Intervention Clinic

The AIC uses evidence-based assessment and intervention approaches to improve the academic skills of students in local schools. Undergraduate students work 1:1 or with small groups of students to deliver interventions and monitor progress. They work collaboratively with graduate students and school staff.



## Faculty-Student Collaborative Research

There are many opportunities for faculty-student collaborative research during school year as well as during the summer. Participating in research will help you gain valuable experiences that will complement future graduate school applications and/or employment. Many research projects allow you to collaborate with current graduate students.



## Summer Reading and Math Intervention

As an extension of the Academic Intervention Clinic, clinic-based summer programs provide area school children with an opportunity to receive reading and math intervention support during summer vacation. You can gain extensive training in the delivery of evidence-based interventions and research through a summer HDC experience.

## And the experiences don't stop there . . .

You can assist local elementary schools with reading and mathematics screening assessments.

You can observe clinic cases within the Human Development Center.

You can work with a faculty member to develop an individualized undergraduate internship experience.
