Garfield Avenue be reconstructed into a circulation spine that safely accommodates pedestrians, cyclists and transit vehicles

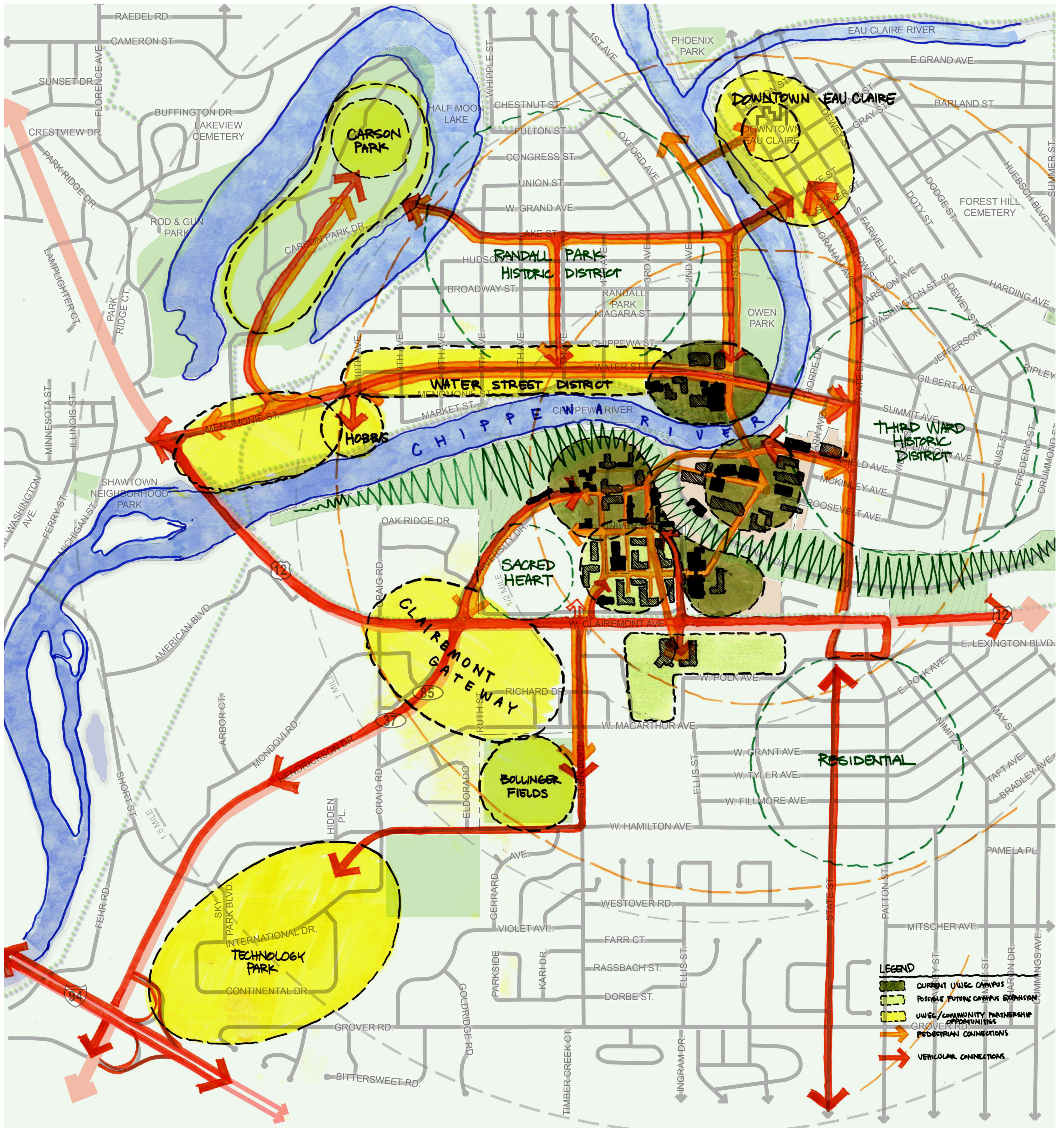
