




Padlet is a virtual wall that allows people to express their thoughts and ideas on a topic easily. It works like an online pin board where people can put any content (e.g. images, videos, documents, text) anywhere on the page, together with anyone, from any device.

You can upload documents, add images, embed videos, and add content with just a double click.

When you sign up for a new account, you get 3 Padlets for free. Many will reuse the same Padlet for a course for quick formative assessments and easy communication.

A Few Uses for Padlet:

- Groups of students can brainstorm ideas and organize thoughts
- Have a Q&A Padlet for your class to allow students to post questions they may have about the course
- End of a lesson activity to check for understanding on a topic
- Students ask questions throughout a class period on the Padlet wall and instructors answer their questions at the end of class, save for the next class, or post an announcement in Canvas



Padlet has introduced **eight** formats for you to choose from to meet a variety of needs.
