Transitions:

1. Make your writing flow by allowing readers to move smoothly from one topic, sentence, or idea to the next.
2. Clarify the relationships between ideas by building bridges between topics and ideas.
3. Allow readers to make connections between ideas and draw conclusions between what they are reading what they previously read.
