## Important Notes:

A. A maximum of 72 credits can be accepted from transfer liberal arts programs at 2-year colleges.
B. Courses and grades both transfer to UW-Eau Claire. This means that the grades you earn prior to transferring will be factored into your cumulative GPA.
C. Students are eligible to transfer with a GPA of 2.0; however, some majors require a higher GPA for admission. Students are encouraged to check out the Transfer Student Admission Requirements website and contact a transfer counselor to discuss major-specific admission criteria.
